For Who Had Close Contact with COVID-19 Infected Person

濃厚接触者 "The contacts"(Noukou close Sesshokusha) are more likely to be infected, so for 14days after the contact with the infected person, take care of your health and do NOT go out unnecessary.

A person infected with COVID-19 can start infecting others from 2 days before the onset of symptoms, until approximately 7 to 10 days after the onset of symptoms. In addition, viral shedding is particularly high before and after the onset of symptoms. Thus, those confirmed as COVID-19 positive must work hard to prevent transmission by refraining from going out for unnecessary reasons, regardless of the presence or lack thereof symptoms.

Check again what is necessary for our lives.

- Avoid the "Three Cs".
- ①Closed spaces with poor ventilation.
- 2) Crowded places with many people nearby.
- (3) Close-contact settings such as close-range
- Be aware of the "Five situations" that can increase the risk of contamination.
- 1) Social gatherings involving alcohol
- 2) Groups of people eating and drinking together over a long period
- 3) Talking without a mask
- 4) Multiple people sharing a confined space
- 5) Switching locations: Socializing and smoking during work breaks

Coming of Age Ceremony after the Civil Code Revision

民法改正後の成人式

The revision to the civil code has lowered the age of adulthood to 18 from 20, starting on April 1, 2022.

*The legal age for drinking, smoking and gambling remain unchanged at 20.

According to this change, the coming of age celebration will be held when people reach the age of 18 hereafter, but only in FY2022 (Reiwa 4), the Coming of Age Ceremony "Seijin shiki" will be held for people aged 18, 19 and 20.

Paperwork for Yellow-plate Vehicles and Mopeds 軽自動車・ 原動機付自転車 などの手続き

- ◆ Complete paperwork to take your vehicle off the road or change ownership early
- ◆ Complete necessary paperwork within the month of March

Annual yellow-plate vehicle tax is charged to the person who is registered as the owner of the vehicle as on April 1st. Due to this, even if you take your car off the road or transfer ownership to someone else after April 2nd, you will be the owner registered as responsible for paying the vehicle's tax for that fiscal year.

Many people therefore rush to complete paperwork to take their car off the road or change ownership at the end of March every year. If you need to complete such paperwork, make sure you do so early with plenty of time to have it processed before the new fiscal year starts. This is also the case for white-plate vehicles, so please leave plenty of time to complete this paperwork, too.

Also, if you have given your vehicle to a car dealership to complete this paperwork on your behalf (both the vehicle and the number plate), be sure to check once again with the dealership that the paperwork has been completed.

[What you need to complete the paperwork]

- Taking a car off the road: *Inkan* (personal seal), number plate, number plate issuing certificate (*hyoshiki koufu shomeisho*)
- Changing ownnership: *Inkan* of both the previous and new owner, number plate issuing certificate ※You will need to take personal ID to complete all paperwork.
- *The type of paperwork and documents required to complete said paperwork differ depending on the type of vehicle, so be sure to check what exactly you need in advance.

◆ To be exempt from a light vehicle tax, it is required to apply every year for those who have a Physical Disability Certificate or a Nursing Certificate.

Regarding "Family Driving", the purpose was limited to going hospital, school or else, but from this year, it will be expanded to general social activities to support the social activities of people with disabilities or else.

◆The tax rate for light vehicles varies depending on the type. Check the city website for details.

It is required to make sewerage system work through the city designated construction shop.

- Who is going to make or remodel sewerage and living in the area of public sewer and agricultural sewerage system area
- Who is using public sewer, agricultural sewerage system or public septic tank and eligible for the following:
 - O When the number of users changes due to moving out, moving in, death, birth, etc.
 - * It is not required for whom using public sewer in Yumegaoka and public septic tank in Aoyama area.
 - O When the name of user changes due to death or other reasons
 - When suspending or starting the use of drainage facilities

* It is not linked to the water supply opening / closing, so each application for water supply and sewerage is required.

ceremony begins. Also, do not wear clothing that is too flashy. The most important people in the ceremony are the children, so the parents do not have to show off.

For graduation ceremonies, black or navy is common, and for matriculations navy or grey are common. As much as possible it is a good idea to wear formal clothing. Avoiding excessive jewelry is also recommended and wearing only necessary rings (e.g. wedding ring) is seen as the most fashionable.
